

**Doctoral researcher of homeopathy**

The University of Hong Kong was ranked by London Times of Higher Education as the top University in Asia this year. To secure this ranking position, it has launched a vigorous program to recruit more international students, particularly Ph.D. level students. As the acting associate dean, I took this opportunity and created a research line that involves homeopathic treatment of children developmental disorders such as autism. The line of research will provide full scholarships for Ph.D. level students for 3-4 years and will enable the student to conduct clinical trials of homeopathic treatment in Hong Kong. The scholarship covers full tuition plus about \$1500/month living expenses. It is not a lot of money, but for someone who wants to establish a research or academic career involving homeopathy, it is a good opportunity that not many other top research universities will be able to offer. So, if you know any quality students with a master degree in any medical or pharmacy, or health related area, who wants to pursue this career path, please make recommendations and ask them to contact me directly. The candidate must have decent mastery of English, for English is the language for thesis and class instruction at HKU. Hong Kong is an internationally dynamic city with lot of culture exchanges. It is very pleasant in winter, but very hot in summer. HKU provides about \$2k/year of travel expenses for each doctoral student who has presentation at international conferences, plus many other grant opportunities.
